I would also like to thank **S & J Automotive** for providing the Thursday evening scrutineering venue. 1.4 JUDGES OF FACT

In accordance with NCR 181 the following officials are deemed to be Judges of Fact.

- (i) Officials at events are deemed to be Judges of Fact of the following:
 - o Direction of entry at a control
 - o Dangerous entry into a control
 - o Time of arrival and departure from control
 - o Not wearing seat belt, helmet or safety clothing
 - o Wrong direction on a special stage
 - o Service Park infringements
 - o Reconnaissance breaches including speeding, incorrect direction on stage and exceeding the number of passes over stage
- (ii) Scrutineers are deemed to be Judges of fact of the following:
 - o Vehicle in un-roadworthy condition
 - o Vehicle with accident damage
 - o Weight of vehicle
 - o Eligibility of vehicle
 - o Crew Apparel
- (iii) Medical Officers are deemed to be Judges of Fact of the Medical Condition of any crew or team member.
- (iv) Speed monitoring Officials using suitable equipment are deemed to be Judges of Fact to the speed of a competing vehicle, reconnaissance vehicle or service vehicle.
- (v) SA Police are deemed to be Judges of fact on open public roads of the following:
 - o Traffic Infringement
 - o Speed of a vehicle
 - o Un-roadworthy vehicle

Article 2. – SERIES ELIGIBILITY

The South Australian Rally Championship counts towards the following:

- 2008 South Australian Rally Championship
- 2008 McLeod Medal
- 2008 Lincoln Harding Memorial Award
- 2008 Steve Winwood 2WD Trophy Award

Article 3. - EVENT DETAILS

- 3.3 The CAMS Permit Number authorising the event is 508/3105/04
- 3.4 The length of the rally will be approximately 315kms, including 8 stages which have a total competitive distance of approximately 114kms. All special stages are of a gravel/dirt surface, held in the Regional Council of Goyder on (closed) public & private roads.
- 3.5 The Event will consist of one Heat on one day.

Article 4. – VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

- 4.2 Entries will be accepted for the following classes -
 - Class P1 - PRC up to 1400cc
 - Class P2 - PRC over 1400cc, up to and including 1600cc
 - Class P3 - PRC over 1600cc, up to and including 2000cc
 - Class P4 - PRC 2WD over 2000cc
 - Class P5 - PRC 4WD over 2000cc (not meeting the requirements of Class P6)
 - Class P5S - PRC 4WD over 2000cc - Refer to Current SA Conditions of Rallying
 - Class P6 - PRC 4WD models first manufactured prior to 1st January 1991 (and appearing on a list of 4WD cars, regardless of the date of manufacture, contained in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.)

 - Class N1 - FIA Group N up to and including 1400 cc
 - Class N2 - FIA Group N over 1400cc, up to and including 1600cc
 - Class N3 - FIA Group N over 1600cc, up to and including 2000cc
 - Class N4 - FIA Group N over 2001cc

 - Class Historic - Category 1, 2 & 3
 - Class Classic - as per current CAMS Classic Regulations

The Clerk of Course reserves the right to amalgamate class awards should 3 or less entries be received for any particular class.

Article 5. – COMPETITOR ELIBILITY

Crews shall comprise of two persons only, both being the holders of a current relevant CAMS licence. One crewmember is to be nominated on the entry form as Driver and the other member as Co-Driver/Navigator.

Article 6. - ENTRIES AND ENTRY FEE

- 6.2 Entries open 0900 hrs on Monday 28 April 2008
- 6.3 Early Entries close 2000 hrs on Friday 9 May 2008
- 6.4 Final Entries close 2000 hrs on Monday 19 May2008

6.5 The entry fee for the Event is fixed as follows:

- Early Entries (non registered) received before 2000 hrs on 9 May 2008 \$500.00
- Final Entries received after 2000 hrs on 9 May 2008 but before 2000 hrs on 19 May 2008 \$550.00

IMPORTANT NOTE: The EFT Description / Lodgement Reference MUST be specified as the name of the entrant (ie. NOT Robertstown Rally or Walkerville All Cars Club).

A written or printed receipt **MUST** be provided with the entry form for ease of processing.

- 6.6 Additional service crew registrations will be \$15 per vehicle (to be registered before the close of Documentation). CAMS Insurance covers registered service crew members only.
- 6.7 The number of entries will be limited to 50. If this limit is exceeded preference will be given to drivers who have registered for the current South Australian Rally Championship, and then in order of receipt of fully completed and fully paid entry form.

The organisers may establish a waiting list.

- 6.8 The starting order will be as specified in the current SA Conditions of Rallying – Part 2.2A.
- 6.9 The organisers reserve the right to cancel or postpone the event should the number of entries be less than 25 or due to circumstances which result in force majeure.
- 6.10 The entry fee will be refunded in full:
- to persons whose entry is not accepted;
 - in the case of the rally not taking place,
 - withdrawal of entry prior to the date of close of entries.

If for reasons of force majeure duly recognised by the Stewards of the Meeting a competitor is unable to start the rally, 75% of the entry fee may be refunded, at the Clerk of Course's discretion.

- 6.11 The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83

6.12 Pacenotes will not be available from the event organisers.

Article 7. - SERVICING AND REFUELLING

- 7.1 The maximum distance between nominated Service Parks and refuel zones will be approximately 55.75km.(including 25km competitive).
- 7.2 Fuel will be available at the following locations:-
SAFF Eudunda has unleaded, Premium unleaded, Diesel and LPG. Robertstown Mobil has unleaded & Premium unleaded & Diesel.
- 7.3 Servicing and refuelling are only permitted in designated service parks and refuelling points as specified in the Road Book and Service Instructions.
- Servicing and/or Refuelling at any other location is NOT PERMITTED.
- 7.4 Throughout the rally, servicing of a competing car may only be carried out in service parks as specified in 7.3. However, the crew, using solely the equipment on board and with no external physical assistance, may perform running repairs on the car at any time, except where this is specifically prohibited by the NRC.
- 7.5 Any infringement concerning servicing or any action defined as "Prohibited Service" noted by the rally officials will be referred to the Stewards of the Meeting, the recommended penalty being exclusion from the results.
- 7.6 If timed service parks are used they shall be indicated in the rally itinerary with Time Controls at the entrance and exit.
- 7.7 The speed of cars in the service parks must not exceed walking pace unless signposted otherwise; offenders will be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting, who will decide on a penalty.

Article 8. – RECONNAISSANCE AND PACE NOTING

- 8.1 Reconnaissance will be available on either:
Sunday 25 May 2008 between 0900 – 1600 for Recce Day 1
- Or
- Friday 30 May 2008 between 0900 – 1600 for Recce Day 2
- 8.2 Reconnaissance by all crews is highly recommended.
- 8.3 A maximum speed limit of 80km/hr is not to be exceeded during reconnaissance. Monitoring of speeds will be undertaken by the Clerk Of Course and any infringements will be reported to the stewards of the event for application of an appropriate penalty, which may be as serious as exclusion.
- 8.4 Crews are only permitted to cover each stage, or part thereof, a maximum of TWO times
- 8.5 All crews are advised to that they will be required to complete and sign a reconnaissance disclaimer (at documentation) noting the intent to undertake reconnaissance and use pace notes during the special stages of the rally.
- 8.6 **Under NO circumstances are crews to travel in the opposite direction to the set Course.** Any breach will be reported to the Stewards of the meeting.

- 8.7 Crews are also advised that the Road Traffic Act will remain in effect for the duration of reconnaissance and that all road rules must be observed (eg complying with advisory signs, obeying speed limits imposed and keeping to the left). Judges of Fact may be on the route to police these regulations.
- 8.8 Reconnaissance may be carried out in any road-registered vehicle. Under body protection, rollover protection, safety equipment and internal navigational aids are permitted. Vehicles must not have any signage, or be easily identifiable as a rally car. Road traffic noise requirements must be adhered to.
- 8.9 The tyres to be used are to have a maximum groove width and depth of 8mm and no other opening in the tread may be greater than 12mm.
- 8.10 Any member of the crew found on the course in the period two months prior to the start of the rally, with the exception of the period allowed for reconnaissance as per these regulations, will be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting for consideration of exclusion or other penalty, unless written approval from Organisers has been obtained.
- 8.11 Any person found to be in breach of the reconnaissance regulations, or who acts in such a manner as to bring the rally into disrepute will be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting who will determine a penalty which can include a substantial monetary fine or the refusal to allow the competitor concerned to start the event.

IV. ODOMETER CHECK

Article 9. – ODOMETER CHECK

9.1 CITY

The official odometer check in the 'City' is done by travelling East along Greenhill Road between two marked power poles and is 5.64km long.

The Start pole is situated 100m West of Goodwood road. It has a sign stating "ODO Start" in white letters on a red background.

The End pole is situated east of Burke Street (directly opposite Laurel Ave). It is marked "ODO Finish" in white letters on a red background.

9.2 SOUTH

The official odometer check in the 'South' is done by travelling South along South Road between two marked power poles and is 4.16km long.

The Start pole is situated approximately 280m south of Sheriffs Road/Pimpala Road (directly opposite Stanley Ct). It has a sign stating "ODO Start" in white letters on a red background.

The End pole is situated 270m South of Greengate Grove. It is marked "ODO Finish" in white letters on a red background.

9.3 NORTH

The official odometer check in the 'North' is done by travelling North West along McIntyre Road between two marked power poles and is 4.96km long.

The Start pole is situated approximately 200m North of Montague road (3rd Light pole). It has a sign stating "ODO Start" in white letters on a red background.

The End pole is situated 150m east of Booloo Street (79 McIntyre Road). It is marked "ODO Finish" in white letters on a red background.

V. DOCUMENTATION & SCRUTINY

Article 10. - DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINY

- 10.1 Documentation will be available during the following times and must be completed prior to presentation of that vehicle for scrutiny:
- Thursday 29 May 2008, 1900 till 2030hrs at S & J Automotive, 33 Woodlands Tce, Edwardstown SA 5039.
- Saturday 31 May 2008, 0700hrs till 0900 at Rally Headquarters, Robertstown Oval.
- 10.2 Vehicles must be presented for scrutiny on Thursday 29 May 2008 between 1900 hrs and 2200 hrs (unless granted an exemption which needs to be applied for in writing to the Clerk of Course with entry form) at: Scrutineering Marquee, Robertstown Oval on Saturday 31 May 2008, 0900hrs till 1030hrs. Failure to comply with these requirements will result in a time penalty being imposed at the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting.
- 10.3 Regional and interstate competitors must apply to the Clerk of Course (in writing with entry form) to have scrutiny undertaken by the appropriate scrutineering authority in their local area. These competitors must present their documentation along with the endorsed scrutiny 'pass' form at Rally Headquarters on Saturday 31 May 2008, 0700hrs till 0900 at Rally Headquarters and the Scrutineering Marquee at Robertstown Oval. Vehicles fitted with a turbo charger must have the turbocharger sealed at the time of scrutineering.
- 10.4 Documents to be presented at documentation include:
- CAMS Competition Licence of BOTH crew members
 - CAMS Vehicle Log Book
 - CAMS Affiliated Club Membership Cards
 - Civil Drivers Licence of BOTH crew members (unless Navigator is holder of a 'National Rally Navigator Only' licence)
 - Vehicle Registration Papers / Permit
 - CAMS Pass Book of BOTH crew members
- All documents presented must be current & not expire over the duration of the event.
- 10.4 Vehicles requiring re-scrutiny, or those vehicles granted an exemption from Article 10.2 are required to attend scrutiny at Rally Headquarters at 0900hrs on Saturday 31 May 2008.
- 10.5 Turbo Scrutiny will be held for all vehicles fitted with a turbocharger on Thursday 24 April 2008 during normal process at the scrutiny venue, listed in 10.2. Vehicles granted exemption from Article 10.2 will be scrutineered as per Article 10.4
- 10.6 Vehicles must be presented for turbo scrutiny with cold turbo-chargers. Crews may present the turbo assembly removed from the vehicle. Entrants are reminded turbochargers must be presented drilled for sealing (see current Australian Rally Championship Regulations – Part 1 Sporting Regulations) Failure to comply with these requirements will result in a penalty being imposed at the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting.
- 10.7 Service Instructions, Door Numbers and Sponsors' Advertising will be available for collection upon completion of documentation. The required placement of supplied advertising will be in accordance with the SA Conditions of Rallying 8.2a. Competitors are required to carry any sponsorship signage supplied by the organisers. Any crew that disagrees with the organisers' placement requirements may lodge a written application for an alternative placement before the end of the documentation period. A decision on the application will be made before the end of documentation.
- 10.8 SOS/OK Board must be presented with the vehicle at scrutineering.

- 10.9 Any entrant who fails to meet vehicle re-presentation requirements as directed will be refused permission to start the event.
- 10.10 Parc fermé will be located at the Finish, where all vehicles will be held until post event scrutiny has been completed on the selected vehicles or the Stewards allow them to be removed. Refer to Article 10.12 of the Series Regulations for early removal. Those crews concerned will be advised at arrival to the final control.
- 10.11 Of the remaining competitors those who wish may leave the finish after their arrival at the final control by signing a declaration that if subsequently required for scrutiny, they will be deemed to have withdrawn from the rally and will not be eligible for any awards or championship points.

VI. RUNNING OF THE RALLY

Article 11. - START

- 11.1 Both driver and co-driver **MUST** be present at Competitors' briefing at 1100 hrs on Saturday 31 May 2008 at the Rally Headquarters. Non attendance will be reported to the Stewards and the recommended penalty will be exclusion.
- 11.2 The Rally will start at 1200 hrs on Saturday 31 May 2008 and the first car will finish at approx 2000 hrs at Robertstown Football Club, Robertstown.
- 11.3 Competing Vehicles are required to be placed in the Staging area no later than 1055.
- 11.4 It is not necessary that a member of the crew is the person who places the vehicle in the staging area. In accordance with the above regulations, a map of the location and directions will be provided to competitors in the road books.
- 11.5 The penalty for late arrival is a report to the Stewards of the meeting, who will decide the extent of the penalty including any monetary penalty and the amount thereof. Notification to the offending crew will be given at the earliest opportunity.
- 11.6 Cars will start special stages at 2 minute intervals.
- 11.7 Special Stages will be closed to competition when the sweep enters the stage. Any crew who arrives at a special stage time control within their late time limit but after the stage has closed are to drive the stage abiding by all applicable road regulations. A derived time considered by the stewards to be fairest will be given to the crew. Crews are to enter their own start and finish times on the time card if the control officials have packed up and/or have left the control area
- 11.8 Any crew that stops on a stage and is passed by the sweep is deemed to have withdrawn from that stage. If they rejoin the stage they are to drive the stage abiding by all applicable road regulations

VII. ACCIDENT PROCEDURE

Article 12– Accident Procedure

- 12.1 In the event of a car stopping in a special stage a warning triangle must immediately be displayed in a conspicuous position at least 50 metres behind the car.
- 12.2 **Stopped Vehicle**
In the event of an accident where no injuries are sustained the OK sign must be clearly displayed to at least the following three cars. Both the warning triangles and the OK sign must be left on display for the whole length of the period that the car is stopped on the course regardless of whether or not the crew remain with the car. Failure to display either or both of these signs as appropriate may result in a report to the Stewards of the meeting.
- 12.3 **SOS / OK**
In the event of an accident where injuries are sustained that require immediate medical attention or where assistance is required with a fire the SOS sign must be displayed to the following cars (unless incapable of doing so), which are required to **STOP**. Any competitor coming on another competitor involved in an accident **MUST STOP** if the SOS is displayed or if there is no visible sign displayed, and render assistance. If possible the first vehicle on the scene is to contact Rally Command by mobile phone or radio, noting car number, cumulative distance to the accident site, and if known, general details of injuries sustained.

The crew on the scene are to determine the most appropriate 2 vehicles to immediately transport written accident details to the next SOS point or Stop Point. No more than 2 vehicles are to proceed past the incident scene without the explicit approval of the Clerk of Course.

The 2 vehicles used to transport details of the incident must proceed to the Stop Point of the stage – after stopping at the first possible communication point if applicable.

At the first practical time crews directly involved must fill in an incident report fully detailing the incident – including actual times of events, and pass it to the Clerk of Course, CRO, or Control official.

VIII. DRUGS IN MOTOR SPORT

Article 13-Drugs in Motor Sport.

- 13.1 All competitors are reminded of the CAMS Anti-Doping policy in the Current CAMS Online Manual of Motor Sport (Section 2, General Regulations).
- 13.2 Tests for Alcohol may be conducted at any time during the event in accordance with the “Procedure for Alcohol Testing” in the Current CAMS Online Manual of Motor Sport.

IX. PROTESTS

Article 14-PROTESTS
